TIDAK perlu bimbang berikutan bekalan ayam dan telur di seluruh negara mencukupi sepanjang tempoh Perintah Kawalan Pergerakan hingga 31 Mac hadapan.

Menteri Pertanian dan Industri Makanan Datuk Seri Dr Ronald Kiandee berkata, jaminan itu diberikan oleh Persekutuan Persatuan-

(KPDNHEP) di Putrajaya tadi.

Perbincangan itu membabitkan beliau bersama Menteri Perdagangan Dalam Negeri dan Hal Ehwal Pengguna Datuk Alexander Nanta Linggi dan 12 pemain industri peruncitan dan makanan negara.

"Untuk ayam dan telur (bekalan) pemain industri memberi jaminan kita masih lagi mempunyai lebih dan beroperasi secara normal," katanya.

Kiandee berkata, dalam perbincangan yang berlangsung pemain industri membangkitkan beberapa perkara yang memerlukan pertimbangan Majlis Keselamatan Negara (MKN).

"Antaranya ialah dari segi rantaian bekalan pengeluaran telur dan ayam dan supaya kedua-dua bahan makanan itu disenaraikan sebagai barangan keperluan," katanya.

Kiandee berkata perkara lain yang dibangkitkan dalam perbincangan itu ialah peningkatan had kuota beras untuk setiap pasar raya kerana pada masa ini orang ramai banyak bergantung kepada premis berkenaan untuk membeli beras.

Sementara itu Nanta berkata KPDNHEP tidak lagi menerima aduan pembelian panik.

"Setakat ini tidak ada masalah dari segi bekalan makanan tapi semua pihak perlu sedia untuk hadapi sebarang kemungkinan selepas ini jika penularan Covid-19 berpanjangan," katanya.

Nanta berkata, pengendali pasar raya turut diminta tidak menaikkan harga barangan sepanjang Perintah Kawalan Pergerakan.

Pengguna boleh melaporkan sebarang kenaikan harga dan isu bekalan kepada KPDNHEP melalui aplikasi WhatsApp di talian 019-2794317, katanya.

PUTRAJAYA - Bekalan ayam dan telur di seluruh negara mencukupi sepanjang tempoh Perintah Kawalan Pergerakan dari 18 hingga 31 Mac ini, kata Menteri Pertanian dan Industri Makanan, Datuk Seri Dr Ronald Kiandee.

Beliau berkata, jaminan itu diberikan oleh Persekutuan Persatuan-Persatuan Penternak Malaysia dalam perjumpaan di Kementerian Perdagangan Dalam Negeri dan Hal Ehwal Pengguna (KPDNHEP) di sini semalam.

Perbincangan itu melibatkan Ronald bersama Menteri Perdagangan Dalam Negeri dan Hal Ehwal Pengguna, Datuk Alexander Nanta Linggi dan 12 pemain industri peruncitan dan makanan negara.

“Untuk ayam dan telur (bekalan) pemain industri memberi jaminan kita masih lagi mempunyai lebihan dan beroperasi secara normal,” katanya kepada pemberita selepas perbincangan selama dua jam di sini semalam.

Sementara itu Alexander Nanta berkata, KPDNHEP tidak lagi menerima aduan pembelian panik.

Minister: Sufficient supply of poultry, eggs during MCO

PUTRAJAYA: There is sufficient supply of poultry and eggs during the implementation of Movement Control Order (MCO) from March 18 to 31, said Agriculture and Food Industry Minister Datuk Seri Dr Ronald Kiangdee.

He said the assurance was given by the Federation of Livestock Farmers' Associations of Malaysia at a meeting held at the Ministry of Domestic Trade and Consumer Affairs (KPDNHEP) here Friday.

The meeting was jointly chaired by Kiangdee and Datuk Alexander Nanta Linggi, who is the Minister of Domestic Trade and Consumer Affairs, and attended by 12 players of the national retail

and food industry.

"For chicken and egg (supply) the industry players have given assurance that there is still surplus in supply and operation is normal," he told reporters after the two-hour meeting here Friday.

Kiangdee said during the meeting, the industry players raised a number of issues that need to be given due consideration by the National Security Council (MKN).

Among issues raised was for eggs and poultry to be listed as essential products, he said.

Kiangdee said another issue raised in the meeting was the increase in rice quota for each supermarket as most people cur-

rently rely on these premises to buy rice.

Meanwhile, Nanta said KPDNHEP no longer received complaints of panic buying.

"Thus far, there has been no problem in terms of food supply but all parties need to be prepared to deal with any possibility of prolonged COVID-19 outbreak," he said.

He said supermarket operators were also urged not to hike price of goods during the MCO period.

"KPDNHEP akan sentiasa mengadakan pemantauan melalui 2,500 penguatkuasa agar bekalan sentiasa mencukupi dan tidak berlaku aktiviti menaikkan harga sesuka hati dari kalangan penjual sepanjang Perintah Kawalan Pergerakan," katanya.

Sementara itu, Dr Ronald berkata, bekalan makanan bagi kumpulan makanan utama termasuk beras, daging, ikan, ayam, sayur-sayuran dan buah-buahan berada pada tahap stabil dan mencukupi.

Beliau turut menafikan peniaga menaikkan harga telur yang dijual RM1 sebiji, sebaliknya masih pada harga lama iaitu 29 hingga 31 sen sebiji.

Katanya, pihaknya akan bekerjasama dengan KPDNHEP bagi memantau harga barangan di pasaran agar peniaga tidak mengambil kesempatan menaikkan harga sepanjang PKP dilaksanakan.

PUTRAJAYA: Kementerian Perdagangan Dalam Negeri dan Hal Ehwal Pengguna (KPDNHEP) membenarkan import penutup mulut dan hidung bagi mengatasi kekurangan bekalan di pasaran domestik ekoran penularan wabak Covid-19.

Menterinya, Datuk Alexander Nanta Linggi, berkata, kebenaran untuk mengimport berkuat kuasa semalam itu adalah susulan harga siling penutup mulut dan

hidung yang dinaikkan daripada 80 sen sekeping kepada RM2 sekeping sekarang.

KPDNHEP berharap langkah ini akan menggalakkan peniaga mengimport penutup mulut dan hidung dalam waktu terdekat, katanya kepada pemberita selepas mengadakan pertemuan dengan 12 pemain industri sektor peruncitan di pejabat KPDNHEP, di sini, hari ini.

"Kalau KPDNHEP masih

hadkan harga siling 80 sen sekeping, pengusaha dan kilang tidak lagi mampu mengeluarkan penutup mulut dan hidung," katanya sambil menambah ia disebabkan kenaikan harga bahan untuk menghasilkan produk tersebut.

Kata Nanta, sebelum ini KPDNHEP sudah melaksanakan larangan mengekspor penutup hidung dan mulut ke luar negara supaya bekalan dalam negara ditingkatkan. — Bernama

Kerajaan tetapkan harga siling dinaikkan kepada RM2

Putrajaya: Kementerian Perdagangan Dalam Negeri dan Hal Ehwal Pengguna (KPDNHEP) membenarkan import topeng muka berkuat kuasa kelmarin, bagi memastikan bekalan barang itu yang diperlukan ketika penularan COVID-19 mencukupi.

Menterinya, Datuk Alexander Nanta Linggi, berkata pada masa sama, aktiviti mengeksport topeng muka juga dibenarkan bagi mengelak bahan mentah berkurangan.

Bagaimanapun, katanya, kerajaan menetapkan harga siling bagi topeng muka diulitkan kepada RM2 berbanding 30 sen sebelum ini kerana kekurangan bahan memproses serta kenaikan harga bahan asas.

"Dengan langkah ini juga, orang ramai boleh mendapatkan topeng muka dalam masa terdekat," katanya pada sidang media selepas menghadiri Perbincangan Bersama Sektor Peruncitan Berkaitan Perintah Kawalan Pergerakan, di sini semalam.

Yang turut hadir: Menteri Pertanian dan Industri Makanan, Datuk Seri Dr Ronald Klandee; Ketua Setiausaha

Kementerian Pertanian dan Industri Makanan, Datuk Zainal Azuan Abu Seman dan Ketua Setiausaha KPDNHEP, Datuk Seri Hasnol Zain Zain Ahmad.

Seramai 12 penggiat industri sektor peruncitan keperluan harian hadir pada perbincangan selama dua jam itu yang antara lain turut menyuarakan pihak industri meningkatkan amalan penjagaan kesihatan di pasar raya dan kemudahan trolli pengguna bagi mengelak jangkitan COVID-19.

Sambil memberi jaminan bekalan makanan mencukupi, beliau juga mahu pengusaha sentiasa bekerjasama memastikan perkara itu serta memaklumkan kepada kementerian sekiranya tidak mencukupi.

COVID-19: Government gives green light to import face masks



Domestic Trade and Consumer Affairs Minister Datuk Alexander Nanta Linggi said at the same time any activity involving the export of face masks would also need to be ceased to ensure PUTRAJAYA: The Domestic Trade and Consumer Affairs Ministry (KPDNHEP) has given the green light for the importation of face masks into the country to ensure there is enough supply in the local market.

The import directive on the item which has become an essential item in the fight against Covid-19 was effective from Thursday.

Its Minister Datuk Alexander Nanta Linggi said at the same time any activity involving the export of face masks would also need to be ceased to ensure sufficient supply in the local market.

He also announced that the government had set the ceiling price of masks to RM2 now, compared to 80 sen previously due to lack of processing materials and increased cost of basic materials.

Alexander said this at a press conference after attending a meeting with representatives of the retail sector on the Movement Control Order here today.

Also present at the meeting were Agriculture and Food Industry Minister, Datuk Seri Dr Ronald Kiandee;

Secretary General of the Agriculture and Food Industry Ministry Datuk Zainal Azman Abu Seman and KPDNHEP secretary-general Datuk Seri Hasnol Zam Zam Ahmad.

Export ban, new price to meet mask demand



Sufficient supply soon: The government has ensured a sufficient supply of face masks by banning exports while setting the price for face masks at RM2 each.

PUTRAJAYA: The government has taken a two-pronged approach to ensure a sufficient supply of face masks by banning exports and allowing imports of the product, while setting the price for a three-ply mask at RM2 each.

Domestic Trade and Consumer Affairs Minister Datuk Alexander Nanta Linggi said the new price – up from 80 sen per piece – was due to the higher production cost of material.

"By allowing face masks to be sold at RM2, we hope to encourage local manufacturers to produce more. For importers, this price will help cover the costs to bring the product into the market.

"With this move, we hope to increase the availability of face masks for Malaysians to use in the wake of the Covid-19 pandemic," he added.

Nanta spoke to reporters after chairing a meeting with Agriculture and Food Industry Minister Datuk Seri Dr Ronald Kiang along with stakeholders in the food production and retail industries.

He said the government's ban on face mask exports came into effect on March 18 and would remain for as long as necessary.

"During the meeting, retailers such as supermarkets and hypermarkets has had asked for the government to relax certain restrictions or regulations to make it easier for them to get supplies as goods are cleared from the shelves fast.

"We are also working on uniform operating hours for outlets selling essential items during the movement control order (MCO) period," he said.

Nanta said the meeting provided the government with information and feedback from stakeholders during the MCO and also the need for a different strategy should this situation be prolonged.

Kiang said food producers had raised some issues which he would bring up with the National Security Council.

He said that for instance, while chicken and egg productions were considered essential, farmers need their support sector to also be in business during the MCO.

"For now, stakeholders say they are able to meet market demand, so there is no need for consumers to panic buy," he added.

He also said supermarkets and hypermarkets had asked for the ministry to raise their quota limit for the supply of rice as their current quota could not meet consumer demand during the enforcement of the order.

"There is sufficient food supply, so there is no need for panic buying. We are constantly monitoring the market to ensure there is supply for the people," he said.
