**SUFFICIENT ESSENTIAL GOODS AVAILABLE: MINISTER**

KUALA LUMPUR: Domestic Trade and Consumer Affairs Minister Datuk Alexander Nanta Linggi has assured that essential goods are sufficient in supply for the entire duration of the Movement Control Order (MCO). He said his ministry was working with the Ministry of Agriculture and Food Industry and is in discussions with food suppliers to ensure essential goods are well stocked and there is no increase in prices. So there is no reason for panic buying. "My deputy and I made surprise visits to several supermarkets," he said, adding that feedback from his ministry's 2,500 enforcement personnel nationwide, confirmed that supplies were sufficient.

## Food being sent to islands around Sabah

**KOTA KINABALU:** Food rations are being sent to islanders affected by the movement control order (MCO) irrespective of the nationality status, says Deputy Chief Minister Datuk Jaujan Sambakong.

He said the MCO prohibited those living in the islands off Semporna and Kota Kinabalu to come to the mainland to buy essentials and carry their petty trades.

"We are helping the people there ... everyone, not only locals," he said when asked if assistance was being provided to the stateless and refugees, as well as the migrants living on islands around Sabah.

Jaujan said all the necessary assistance would be channelled directly to the islands by various authorities.

In a large island community of Pulau Gaya near here, Tanjung Aru assemblyman Datuk Junz Wong said efforts were under way to send in basic supplies when the authorities banned movements between the island and the mainland after positive cases of Covid-19 were detected.

"We are organising a food supplies trip to Pulau Gaya and hope it will reach them as soon as possible," he said.

Wong, who is State Agriculture and Food Industry Minister, said food was also supplied to 6,000 people in the Tanjung Aru constituency who were also affected by the MCO.

## Nanta: Essential goods in sufficient supply throughout duration of movement control order

**KUALA LUMPUR:** Domestic Trade and Consumer Affairs Minister, Datuk Alexander Nanta Linggi, has given an assurance that essential goods are in sufficient supply for the entire duration of the movement control order imposed by the government to contain Covid-19.

He said his ministry was working with the Ministry of Agriculture and Food Industry to hold regular meetings with food suppliers to ensure that essential goods would be in sufficient supply, so that people would not resort to panic buying following the extension of the order until April 14.

"My deputy and I made surprise visits to several supermarkets," he said, adding that feedback from his ministry's enforcement personnel across the country was that supplies were sufficient, with no increase in prices.

"To ensure that food supplies are sufficient and not subject to price increases, 2,500 enforcement officers have been deployed nationwide," Nanta said in a public service announcement

broadcast by all television stations here yesterday.

He said the ministry would take stern action against traders who violated the Control of Supplies Act 1961 and Price Control and Anti-Profiteering Act 2011.

The minister also urged all traders, including online e-commerce operators, to be honest and ethical, and not to take advantage of the current situation.

At the same time, Nanta advised the public: "I understand the difficulties facing consumers at this time. Plan your purchases wisely. Don't overdo it". — Bernama

## APMM tingkat pengawasan di perairan Terengganu

### KUALA TERENGGANU

- Agensi Penguatkuasaan Maritim Malaysia (APMM) Terengganu mempergiat rondaan pengawasan di perairan negeri bagi mengelakkan kemasukan nelayan asing yang dikhuatiri membawa kepada penularan pandemik koronavirus (Covid-19).

Pengarah APMM Negeri Terengganu, Kepten Maritim Muhammad Suffi Mohd Ramli berkata, penguatkuasaan itu dilakukan selaras dengan Perintah Kawalan Pergerakan (PKP) yang dijalankan sehingga 14 April nanti bagi membasmi wabak itu.

“Pada waktu ini, aktiviti perikanan masih dibenarkan. Ia merupakan aktiviti di bawah *essential service* (perkhidmatan penting) namun ia hanya boleh dilakukan oleh nelayan yang mempunyai permit atau lesen daripada Jabatan Perikanan Malaysia saha-

ja,” katanya ketika dihubungi di sini semalam.

Tambah beliau, rondaan itu turut dilakukan bagi membanteras aktiviti jenayah rentas sempadan seperti pence-robahan nelayan asing.

Muhammad Suffi berkata, pihaknya juga menjalankan rondaan di beberapa kawasan tarikan pelancong dan kawasan yang menjadi tumpuan pemancing di perairan Terengganu seperti Pulau Redang, Pulau Perhentian, Pulau Kapas dan Pulau Tenggol.

“Tinjauan dan rondaan yang dijalankan mendapati lokasi-lokasi itu kini lengang,” kata beliau. - *Bernama*
